

The NEW Dynamic Plaque

LEED Dynamic Plaque has been launched by the U.S. Green Building Council to drive a more performance-based approach to LEED and to continue to enhance interest in the LEED for Existing Buildings: Operations & Maintenance standard. It is evolving as an efficient option to maintaining LEED certification and is available to all previously certified LEED EB, NC, CS and CI projects.

Speaker

Scot Horst, Chief Product Officer, U.S. Green Building Council. Scot is responsible for all product research, development, implementation and execution at USGBC. In his previous position he oversaw LEED at the U.S. Green Building Council. He guided staff and volunteers in the development of LEED v4, and is chief inventor of the LEED Dynamic Plaque, a scoring device for whole building performance. Scot established LEED as a global benchmark through a global, regional and local grow th strategy that includes the LEED International Roundtable, now comprised of 38 countries and responsible for LEED technical development around the w orld.

1) The Canada-Ontario Job Grant can subsidize CaGBC-GTC education!

The Chapter has been approved as a training partner for the <u>Canada-Ontario Job Grant</u>, part of a new agreement between Ontario and the federal government to provide funding for new, employer-driven, training initiatives. Under this program, the province can support employers in taking a greater role in their workforce skills development. The program is structured so that the cost of training becomes a shared investment between employers and the government. Employers get reimbursed for up to two-thirds of the cost of training! 3) Greenest School in Canada 2015

The Canada Green Building Council and the Canada Coalition for Green Schools are searching for the 2015 Greenest School in Canada. This is a school at the elementary or secondary level that truly exemplifies how sustainability can be integrally woven into the infrastructure, culture and curriculum. The winning school will receive \$2,000 in prize money to use for a green activity and the coveted title of Greenest School in Canada. Canada's Greenest School will also be submitted as the official Canadian entry into the Greenest School on Earth competition, awarded annually by the Center for Green Schools at the U.S. Green Building Council. Winners of the international competition receive an additional \$1000 to put toward a new or ongoing sustainability project. To read more about the submission and review process, visit the website.

4) LEED Canada Hits Another Major Milestone with its 2,000th Certified Project!

Canada's total number of LEED certified buildings hit another milestone in late 2014 with the certification of its 2,000th project. This follows an earlier announcement made by the Canada Green Building Council (CaGBC) on October 7, which saw the total number of registered projects hit 5,000. Cumulative totals for LEED certified and registered projects in Canada now sit at 2,041 and 5,187, respectively. Of the 2,041 LEED certified projects, over 800 are in Ontario - that's over 40%!
